
# Why change the yardstick?

## From Smart to Family-Centered Cities

- *Smart* often meant *technology and economic first*.
- Yet development is measured by *how families form, live, grow, and stay* in a city.
- Our new lens: cities that *generate common good*
- Missing yardstick: *life, belonging, care, and opportunity* outcomes across life events, not sensors or apps.
- City Maturity Index (CMI) reorients progress around *four development dimensions: Jobs, Habitat, Health / Security, and Education*.



## Experimental Methodology



### CHALLENGE

What is the need to be satisfied or potential to be developed?

### INVESTIGATION

What is the relevance of the challenge, what is its origin, trajectory and possible solutions?



### TRAINING

What motivations, capabilities and knowledge need to be developed to transform the challenge into a solution?

### TRANSFORMATION

What behaviors, processes and indicators do we see with the solution to the challenge? What leap in quality is observed in the new challenges to be faced?



### CRITERIA

Natural and social purposes for transformation

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# Live Cases

## Cross-case insights

**Different paths, one principle:** serve the *whole person within the family and community*.

**When governance aligns around this,** results multiply:

- Faster access,
  - Better coordination,
  - Stronger social trust,
  - Reusability flywheel.
- 
- Technology helps, but trust and proximity deliver change.
  - Shared governance and cross-sector partnerships sustain results.
  - Cities evolve when they learn from each other through shared metrics.

# How to Measure (Quantitative)?

- City Maturity Index (CMI) reorients development around four *dimensions*:

**Work, Habitat, Health & Safety, and Education,**

—*three foci*:

**People, Families, Communities.**

—and more than twenty combined *indicators*:

- . **Technology – Cities in Motion – 10 key indicators**
- . **Person – HDI Indicator**
- . **Family - cities for families – Veneto – 10 Indicators**
- . **Communities - Social Cohesion Indicator**
- . **Nature – 5 Indicators**
- . **Governance – SDG 16**
- . **Partnerships and participation – SDG 17**
